**MOTION TO CLARIFY**

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Plaintiff, Neldon P. Johnson, Pro Se Plaintiff, asks this Court to clarify the contradiction in the status of this case as follows:


The receiver, Wayne Klein, filed a "Notice of Stay" with the Court on November 13, 2018 that says this case has been stayed by an order issued by Judge Nuffer. I understood that to mean nothing further could be done. If the case is stayed then neither party can do anything until the case is not stayed, as I understand it.

On November 29, 2018 the government violated the stay of this case and filed a Opposition to Johnson's Motion for Preliminary Injunction. The government has mischaracterized this case. This is not a Civil Rights Case, but it is a fraud on the court case in which my constitutional rights have been violated by unlawful, illegal and discriminatory actions and steps taken by the government and allowed, encouraged and

abetted by the other defendants, including the judge who conspired with them to commit fraud on the court. I want to oppose the government's motion, but I do not know if the stay prevented them from filing it and therefore the Court will ignore it, or if I can file a reply to oppose the motion. I want to oppose the government's motion, I don't know if I am allowed to do so.

Will the Court ignore the government's motion because it violated the stay to file it? Or will the Court allow me to file a reply to oppose the motion? If I file something will I be violating the stay? I assume I am allowed to ask for clarification without violating the stay.
